Reception Home Learning

The following are some more ideas to help you at home. The activities cover areas from the Early Years Foundation Stage. Many of these activities should be able to be done without needing to buy any resources.

We will still set you a challenge a day on Parent Hub. Don't forget PE with Joe Wicks at 9am and the phonics lessons.

- Retell stories and act them out.
- Help your grown up with preparing food.
- Thread pasta onto wool or string.
- Play musical statues.
- Dance to music like we used to in our classrooms!
- Paint with water in the garden.
- Make puppets for storytelling.
- Play guessing games. For example, can you guess what animal I am describing?
- Play board games.
- Pairing socks.
- Add numbers to 20 on pegs and order them.
- Measure ingredients.
- Sing number songs for example "5 Currant Buns".
- Sort toys by colour or shape.
- Sort coins.
- Make patterns.
- Make a bowling game using empty plastic bottles or toilet rolls.
- Hide an object in a mystery bag and give clues to what might be inside.
- Tap out syllables of your name and other words.
- Make a family tree. Who is in your family?
- Freeze small toys in ice. How can you get them out of the ice?
- Look for different sorts of ICT in your home. How does the microwave work? What happens when you press the remote control?
- Make shakers with rice in pots.
- Use your phonics to write about your day in your red book. We will enjoy looking at these when we return to school.
- Again using your phonics, write a story that is based in different settings. For example, in space, in the forest, at the seaside.
- Can you make up your own super hero and write about them? Design the super powers that they could have.
