Freezing Fun!

Forest Schools takes place in all weathers (with the exception of heavy winds, thunder storms or extreme weather conditions). We took the opportunity to have some "Freezing Fun!" with Years 3 & 5 during the last cold spell.

Year 3 explored the field and Edible Playground area for pockets of ice or frost, frozen leaves and soil. They used their ears to listen carefully for the crunching sounds as they walked across the field.

Picking up frozen leaves, they examined the many ice patterns that were formed on the surfaces and edges of the leaves. Many leaves were frozen together and the children enjoyed snapping them.



Exploring the field and Edible Playground area, the

children found frozen puddles and pockets of ice that contained bits of twigs, soil & leaves.



In the Edible Playground they were bemused by how one side of a raised bed was frozen solid and covered in ice, while the opposite side, the soil was loose and warm. Through discussion they worked out that the defrosted side had been warmed by the sun.



Using the difference in temperature between their hands and the wooden posts, they had fun leaving their hand impressions on the posts as their warmer hands melted the frost.

Everyone arrived to school on the 18th January to a layer of SNOW!!! Some people liked it and wanted more, others on the other hand wanted it gone ASAP!!

It was fortunate for Year 5 that staff and children came into school through the main entrance rather than the normal school gates – The Playground was covered in lots of untouched white stuff (Snow!)




Even though it was cold, the Year 5 children were adequately dressed for some fun in the snow.

We have achieved the Bronze Award for all our hard work




We have joined with more than 13,000 schools taking action to help the environment. We have signed up to the Woodland Trust's Green Tree Schools Award.


Mental Health Week
